Member Benefits/Information

Members are welcome to borrow from the fire cache, and/or can get help with burn planning, permitting, and implementation. Members also have access to PBA grants and training opportunities.

Fire cache (burn trailer) includes:

- Drip torches, fuel tanks, and prescribed burn signage
- Wide variety of hand tools
- VHF radios and harnesses
- Weed Trimmers/Chain Saws/Backpack Pumps/ATV Sprayers/Backpack Leaf Blowers
- Two 55 and one 200-gallon slip-in units (water tank with pump, hose, and sprayer)
- Three water tanks (500-2000 gallons) with transfer pump and 2000 feet of fire hose
- Other misc. tools and equipment

For burns requiring PBA volunteers and coordination:

Host provides:

- Mobile beverages and food for all volunteers
- Suggested donation to PBA for burn coordination
 - Privately funded in-season burn: Recommended \$250 + \$1/acre
 - State/federal-incentivized burn: 25% of contract for burn implementation (with state/federal funding, for example EQIP funding)
- Trailer: available to all members. As burn host, you provide:
 - Minimum of a ³/₄ ton pickup to haul trailer
 - Non-ethanol Fuel for Small Engines
 - Mixed Fuel for Torches (65% diesel/35% gas)
- Air quality permits: <u>http://www.ncuaqmd.org/index.php?page=burn.permits</u>
- Burn Boss: At landowner's discretion
- Stipends for participating volunteer fire departments: Recommended \$250/day/engine

HCPBA Prescribed Fire Ranking:

- PBA-coordinated burns will be ranked based on participation in the HCPBA and unit preparedness
 - It is recommended that you attend **two** HCPBA burns before requesting to host a burn on your property.
 - All HCPBA burns will require the following (help is available through the HCPBA):
 - Basic Burn Plan
 - Prepared Unit
 - Necessary Permits
 - Agency + Neighbor Outreach

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
